School Uniforms

Magnolia Elementary School will follow the mandatory uniform policy established by the Prince George's County Public Schools for the current school year. Students are to be dressed appropriately in the school uniform each day and must adhere to this policy with no exceptions/substitutions. Students have several options in each category to make selections. Remember, shoes are included in the dress code

Girls: Pre-Kindergarten through Grade Five

- Navy skirts w/yellow peter pan collared blouse (long or short sleeve) or yellow Polo style shirt (long or short sleeve)
- Navy Blue skort w/yellow Polo style shirts (long or short sleeve) or peter pan collared blouse (long or short sleeve)
- Navy blue uniform pants w/yellow Polo/golf style shirts (long or short sleeve)
- Navy blue or white tights, knee or ankle socks (no slouch socks)
- Navy blue cardigan sweaters (navy sweatshirts)

Girls: Grade Six Only

- Khaki (tan) skort with yellow Polo style shirts (long or short sleeve) or Peter Pan-collared blouse (long or short sleeve) or peter pan-collared blouse.
- Solid khaki (tan) skirts or pants with yellow polo style shirts (long or short sleeve) or Peter Pan-collared blouse.
- White or nude tights, knee or ankle socks (no slouch socks)
- Navy blue cardigan sweaters (sweatshirts)

Boys: Pre-Kindergarten through Grade Five

- Yellow Polo/golf style shirts (long or short sleeve). Shirts must not be oversized. White T-shirts or undershirts underneath (no logos, tucked in at all times, and not visible beyond the sleeve length of the shirt)
- Navy blue uniform pants
- Navv blue uniform shorts
- Navy blue cardigan or v-neck sweater (navy sweatshirts)
- Navy, black or white socks (no slouch socks)
- Plain belts black, brown, or navy blue. Belts must be buckled at the waist at all times

Boys: Grade Six Only

- Yellow Polo/golf style shirts (long or short sleeve). Shirts
 must not be oversized. White T-shirts or undershirts underneath (no logos, tucked in at all times, and not visible beyond the sleeve length of the shirt)
- Khaki (tan) uniform pants
- Khaki (tan) uniform shorts
- Navy blue cardigan or v-neck sweater (sweatshirts)

Shoes: All Grade Levels

All students should wear solid black or brown soft-soled shoes or solid black sneakers. During the winter or cold weather students may wear solid black or brown soft-soled boots. Students must <u>not</u> wear <u>colored shoes or shoes with stripes</u> that are not within the uniform guidelines.

Student Arrival

Students should arrive to school no earlier than 9:00 am. Students are tardy at 9:16 am. All students eat breakfast. Breakfast is 9:15 am—9:30 am. Due to safety concerns and morning arrival procedures, parents are only permitted to escort students to the front door of the main lobby entrance. Students are directed and/or escorted to their designated classrooms by staff and/or student safety patrols.

Student Dismissal

Student dismissal begins @ 3:25 pm. Students are dismissed in accordance to mode of transportation (e.g. van, bus, car, walkers). Early dismissal of students ends at 3:00 pm. During dismissal, parents/guardians must wait outside. If there is a change in the mode of transportation, a written letter of notification must be sent to school with the student. Only in the case of an extreme emergency will a request be granted via telephone. All requests must be made to the principal. Excessive late student pick-ups of car riders will result in the student taking their assigned mode of transportation home as a walker or bus rider.

Class Assignments

Due to safety and privacy concerns for all students, class assignments are no longer posted on the front doors. Parents may access the Parent Portal to determine their child's class assignment. The first day of school, students will be directed to report to specific locations throughout the school and on school grounds according to grade level. Staff members will be available to assist students.

Emergency Forms-Student Registration Contact Information

Student emergency forms are critical. The forms are utilized to contact parents and/or parent designees in the case of an emergency. Information provided on student emergency forms is used to verify persons approved by the parent/guardian to pick-up a student. Student emergency forms do not give parent designees authorization to visit classrooms or pick-up students without the parents consent. Please complete the student emergency form immediately upon receipt and return to the school.

Parent/guardian telephone numbers and addresses on the emergency form must be the same information submitted on the student registration form. Student registration form information is the official documentation for students. If addresses and telephone numbers have changed, parents are required to complete a new registration form to provide updated information.
